<u>SoTL</u> <u>Research</u> The Scholarship of Teaching & Learning (SoTL) is a specialized subset of educational research conducted across disciplines. Faculty and Grad students: if your human subjects research is SoTL, please submit your IRB protocol using the UMD Systemwide application linked here, instead of UMBC's Kuali process.



Tips for Human Subjects Researchers

- **Faculty**: IRB administrative staff have recently revamped our post-approval monitoring (PAM) process for expedited and full board review research. Please <u>reference this checklist</u> to prepare for possible, future, PAM of your human subjects research.
- **Grad Students**: If your Master's Thesis or Dissertation is dependent on human subjects research projects, please plan early for IRB protocol submissions and amendments. Research with humans may not begin until the IRB protocol is approved; implementing changes to the original protocol cannot happen until the amendment is approved. As an R1 institution, the IRB staff and Board require sufficient time to review and approve a high volume of protocols in compliance with federal regulations and policies.
- Grad & Undergrad Students: Before you submit an IRB protocol...
 - Complete CITI's (Human Subjects) <u>Social/Behavior Research Course</u>
 - o <u>Determine Exempt or Expedited Category status</u> with your Faculty Advisor
 - Include your Faculty Advisor as research personnel, and attach a completed <u>faculty</u> <u>advisor certification form</u> to your IRB proposal
 - Attach documents of <u>everything you plan to say or show to your prospective participants</u>
 (i.e., recruitment wording/flyer, survey/interview questions, adult consent form, minor
 assent form, parent permission form, etc.)
