Fingerprinting & Background Checks



Every adult (age 18+) listed on an IRB protocol working on research activities with minors (age <18) on UMBC property, must complete a background check and fingerprinting to be filed with UMBC's HR/Talent Acquisition. UMBC property includes web-conferencing and UMBC research in locations that do not have official minor protections oversight. The IRB protocol PI's department is responsible for the costs associated with fingerprinting and background checks of the research team. These services are offered by the UMBC Police station (by appointment, \$80 pp) and the off campus vendor <u>1A (\$55 pp)</u>. Service status/results must be directed to <u>hrbackground@umbc.edu</u>.

University of Maryland, College Park, the host institution for the Scholarship in Teaching & Learning umbrella IRB protocol, is transitioning to a new IRB management system. To accommodate the transition, they will pause the acceptance of new IRB protocols under this umbrella from December 1, 2024, to December 1, 2025. Existing SoTL IRB protocols will continue to be managed by College Park. New SoTL IRB protocol applications may be filed directly through UMBC's IRB Kuali submission process.

Legacy Protocols



Do you currently have a Legacy IRB protocol? In January 2025, IRB Administrative Staff will contact PIs to request that they fully convert their legacy protocol format to the more dynamic Kuali application. This conversion will streamline future amendment, continuation, and auditing requests for both PIs and the IRB.
