Pls of new protocols (& amendments) that indicate the involvement of minor participants, are asked to complete a supplementary <u>Google Form with additional</u> <u>information about minor interactions</u>. The form responses will be reviewed by Human Resources. The HR Background Check Specialist will contact the PI with guidance on any needed next steps. HRPI & the IRB must receive confirmation from HR, on the research team's background checks & fingerprinting clearance, before the respective protocol can be approved.
